ALL SYSTEMS GO!

The "All Systems Go: Coherence Across Systems" event, held on August 1 and 2, 2024, was a key moment in building partnerships between education and community systems to support student development and success. Attendees connected with over 36 education experts and 50 community representatives, sharing innovative strategies. Keynote speakers, including Dr. Bruce D. Perry, offered valuable insights on topics like trauma and resilience. The event aimed to streamline services, align legislative requirements with practical tools, and enhance capacity within educational systems, contributing to a movement addressing historical inequities and promoting integrated education in California.

COST OF POVERTY EXPEREINCE

In August, the Kern County Superintendent of Schools (KCSOS) Community Schools team, in partnership with the Equity and Inclusion Department, facilitated the **Cost of Poverty Experience** (COPE) for staff at the Rio Bravo-Greeley Union School District, a grantee of Kern County's Community Schools initiative. The COPE simulation offers a profound exploration of the realities of poverty through the perspective of actual families. The event also saw the participation of fellow Central Valley Regional Technical Assistance Center (CV-RTAC) coordinators from Fresno.

One staff member reflected on the experience, stating, "Living in a state of survival is incredibly stressful. It makes me angry. Accessing resources takes too long, and people aren't very friendly. It affects all aspects of my life, including family, work, and community."
