On April 7, 2025, the CV R-TAC, in partnership with WestEd, hosted a virtual learning session focused on student voice in community schools. Titled "*From Engagement to Leadership: Youth as Change-*

**Makers in Community Schools**," the event spotlighted student leadership as a catalyst for meaningful change.

A powerful highlight was the student panel featuring Maya Cheek,
Natalie Cascio, Shayra Castillo, and Leslie Herrera. These students
spoke about their experiences, offering thoughtful responses to
questions like: "What does a community school feel like to you?"
and "How can schools inspire students to lead change?"

# LEADING AND LEARNING AT ROOSEVELT ELEMENTARY

On March 11, 2025, **Roosevelt Elementary** in the **Kingsburg Elementary Charter School District** hosted a dynamic Leading and Learning visit, led by **Community Schools Coordinator Linda Simmons**. **Superintendent Dr.** 

Wesley Sever warmly welcomed attendees, sharing the district's mission and the early stages of their implementation journey. Throughout the day, participants engaged in a school tour, presentations, and collaborative discussions that highlighted Roosevelt's commitment to whole-child development and community-centered learning.
